

COVID-19 HEALTH & SAFETY IN SCHOOLS (2021-22)

The following document is intended for OSBCU members of the Joint Health and Safety Committee (JHSC) or the Health and Safety Representative (HSR). It has two purposes:

- 1. To evaluate and improve the measures and procedures in place to protect workers from exposure to COVID-19; and
- 2. Ensure the School Board complies with their requirements under the Occupational Health and Safety Act (OHSA) and the regulations, Ministry of Education Reopening Guides and B-Memos, and Public Health Guidance.

To achieve these purposes, we have provided the following questions (non-exhaustive) to raise if you are meeting with School Board representatives at a JHSC meeting or with a health and safety inspector from the Ministry of Labour, Training and Skills Development. The questions raised are either new requirements or gaps in last year's reopening plans.

	Risk Assessment – Has the Board reassessed the risks of workplace violence, including a reassessment of the risks from students involved in previous incidents of violence? Have staff received information and instruction (worker safety plans) related to a risk of workplace violence from a student with a history of violent behaviour? All staff who work with or are likely to encounter* a student with a history of violence must receive information and instruction contained in the safety plan. *Applies if encountering the student in the course of their work will likely result in bodily injury. 	Masking- Will the Board, in collaboration with the regional public health unit, consider sending out a document to families outlining acceptable masking for students? 	Masking – What will the procedure be for students that can wear a mask but decide not to?	All students should wear a mask for source control, except for eating and drinking. Some students may require exemptions. Outside masking and in JK/SK is strongly recommended. Assess for potential risk of workplace violence.	
	Masking – In what situations would a worker need to wear a fitted N95 respirator? Do we have workers required to wear N95 respirators, and will they have access to those on the first day of school? Have they been trained and passed fit-testing?	All workers performing an aerosolgenerating medical procedure (AGMP) or working in the same room where AGMPs are performed must wear a fitted respirator. 	Masking – Has the Board set aside hypoallergenic masks for workers who suffer rashes, breakouts and skin irritation? Have workers received information on how to prevent skin reactions from prolonged masks usage?	Wearing PPE should not cause other hazards, including undue stress, discomfort or heat. 	Training – How does the Board ensure all staff have received training on COVID-19 Reopening Plans for 2021-2022? Will all staff receive training by the first day of student instruction or their first day back to work? Does the School Board maintain training records?
